## Guam Early Intervention System (GEIS), Part C Report Period April 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021

Based on the data presented for report period April 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021. Indicators 1, 7, 8A ,8B and 8C met the 100% compliance target requirement for this reporting date range. During this quarter, the program continued to work with families via on-line home visiting, emails or personal phone connections with families with meeting our timelines. As of July 2021, GEIS has started face-to-face home visits and meetings with some families.

GEIS continues to work hard, especially during this pandemic, to deliver timely services to work with families, via on-line home visiting, emails or personal connection via parents phones using their choice of phone apps (imessage, WhatsAppetc). As of July 2021, GEIS is starting up services face-to-face with some families.
