Based on the data presented for report period July 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023. Indicators 7, 8A, 8B & 8C met the 100% compliance target requirement for this quarterly reporting.

Indicator 1: Percent Infants and toddlers with IFSPs who receive early intervention services on their IFSP's in a timely manner	<p><u>7/1/2023 to 9/30/2023</u> 97.14% (N=34/35)</p> <p>Target: 100% <i>Not Target MET</i></p>	<p>Indicator 1, as of this quarter, resulted in 97.14% (34/35) of children receiving early intervention services on their IFSP's in a timely manner service delivered within 30 days service was recommended in child's IFSP).</p> <p>There were 35 infants and toddlers who were determine eligible to receive with early intervention services on their IFSP's in a timely manner. Of the thirty-five (35), <i>thirty-three (33), received timely services and one (1) was late due to parent cancelling sessions.</i></p> <p><i>There was one (1) did not receive timely service due to a program delay. The service coordinator miscalculated the due date for timely services, resulting in late initial nursing services by one day and completed 31 days after the initial IFSP.</i></p> <p>There were (4) children referred during the previous quarterly reporting, but timely services will begin July 2023. All four children received timely services.</p>
Indicator 7: Percent of eligible infants and toddlers with IFSPs for whom an initial evaluation, initial assessment and an initial IFSP meeting were conducted within Part C's 45-day timeline.	<p><u>7/1/2023 to 9/30/2023</u> 100 % (N=32/32)</p> <p>Target: 100% <u>Target MET</u></p>	<p>Indicator 7 resulted in 100 % (32/32) of eligible children, with Initial IFSPs conducted within Part C's 45-day timeline for this quarterly report.</p> <p>Based on data this quarter, there were thirty-seven (37) referred for services.</p> <p>Nineteen (19) were delayed due to parent delays (canceled sessions by parents), five (5) were delays due to exceptional circumstances (due to the recent typhoon in May. Parents wanted to address home needs (being displaced due to the typhoon, water, power, etc..).</p> <p>In addition, five (5) children are pending completion and submission of their IFSPs due to parent delays (1 parent wanted to wait until they return of off-island, 1 parent request to reschedule evaluation, 3 parents requested for another time due to parent's conflicting schedule)</p> <p>The remaining thirty-two (32) children had their Initial IFSPs within Part C's 45-day timeline.</p>

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<p>Indicator 8: Percent of toddlers with disabilities exiting Part C with timely transition planning for whom the Lead Agency has:</p> <p>A. Developed an IFSP with transition steps and services at least 90 days, and at the discretion of all parties, not more than nine months, prior to the toddler’s third birthday;</p> <p>B. Notified (consistent with any opt-out policy adopted by the State) the SEA and the LEA where the toddler resides at least 90 days prior to the toddler’s third birthday for toddlers potentially eligible for Part B preschool services; and</p> <p>C. Conducted the transition conference held with the approval of the family at least 90 days, and at the discretion of all parties, not more than nine months,</p>	<p>A. Transition Plan: <u>7/1/2023 to 9/30/2023</u> 100% (N=26/26) Target: 100% Target MET</p>	<p>For this quarter, Indicator 8A resulted in 100% (26/26) of children with transition steps developed with families in the IFSP not fewer than 90 days—and, at the discretion of all parties, not more than 9 months—before the toddler’s third birthday.</p> <p>Based on data, twenty-six (26) children were at transition age.</p> <p>All twenty-six (26) had transition steps developed with families in the IFSP not fewer than 90 days—and, at the discretion of all parties, not more than 9 months—before the toddler’s third birthday.</p>
	<p>B. Notification to LEA: <u>7/1/2023 to 9/30/2023</u> 100% (N=22/22) Target: 100% Target MET</p>	<p>For this quarter, Indicator 8B resulted in 100% (22/22) of toddlers exiting Part C and potentially eligible for Part B where notification to the LEA occurred not fewer than 90 days before the third birthday of the toddler with a disability if that toddler may be eligible for preschool services under part B of the Act.</p> <p>Based on data, <i>Of the twenty-six with transition steps developed with families in the IFSP, there was one parent delay who had refused an LEA notification, later decided to go forward. Two other children were screen-out of the program prior and one was deceased during the transition process.</i></p> <p>The remaining twenty-two (22) children exited GEIS with LEA notification submitted during by this reporting period were submitted timely</p>
	<p>C. Transition Conference: <u>7/1/2023 to 9/30/2023</u> 100% (N=22/22) Target: 100% Target MET</p>	<p>For this quarter, Indicator 8C resulted in 100% (22/22) of toddlers having a transition conference as required in the IDEA, Part C. <i>Based on regulations: “If a toddler with a disability may be eligible for preschool services under part B of the Act, the lead agency, with the approval of the family of the toddler, convenes a conference, among the lead agency, the family, and the LEA not fewer than 90 days—and, at the discretion of all parties, not more than 9 months—before the toddler’s third birthday to discuss any services the toddler may receive under part B of the Act”.</i></p> <p><i>Based on the data, there were a total of 23 children needed a transition conference. One (1) delay was due to parent who refused an LEA and transition conference. The remaining twenty-two (22) children with LEA notifications submitted to Part B received timely transition conferences.</i></p>
