

EDTECH CORNER



Floop is a cloud-based website where students can receive annotated feedback from teachers and peers. Students

upload images of an assignment to the platform, and teachers put markers in places where they want to provide written feedback. Students are able to see and respond to comments, creating a feedback loop that allows teachers to see patterns of student learning.

Students get the feedback they need when they need it. Give feedback 4x faster than traditional methods with a digital dropbox and comment banks. (Adam, 2020)

Frank U. Candaso, Jr. is a 35-year-old Frank U. Lujan Barrigada and a 1st grade teacher at Manuel U. Lujan Elementary School in Yoña.

New to the world of writing children's books, he finds inspiration in his strong connection with social-emotional learning and tries to incorporate encouraging messages into his stories. Certified in Fine Arts with a background in graphic arts for over 20 years, his story illustrations try to capture his surroundings in ways that help create a comforting, yet exciting, display of art that takes the reader on a visual journey.

With the new book The Sihek and the Thing that was Different, he hopes to spread a positive message about the differences within oneself and others, and how these differences can be embraced and repurposed to create a better community; even a better world. In the future, he hopes to take other characters discovered in the book and create meaningful stories through their experiences that touch on other important encounters children may face.

A Death-Struck Year, her debut novel, is set in Portland, Oregon during the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1918. The world of St. John del Mar, in which Isle of Blood and Stone and Song of the Abyss take place, was inspired by a childhood love of the Indiana Jones movies, as well as a lifelong fascination with old, old maps. 
